Subject:Awards to teachers for Innovations and Experimentation in Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (2015-16)

Madam/Sir,

Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan invites projects/papers from the teachers of Kendriya Vidyalayas under the scheme of "Innovation & Experimentation in Education". Under this scheme, Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan gives awards to 10 teachers from Secondary/Sr. Secondary and 10 teachers from Primary level.

- 2. It is said that an organization without any innovation & experimentation by its functionaries becomes a static organization and its growth and development is retarded in the long run.
- 3. Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan is considered as a pace setting institution in the field of school education and hence to improve the system and to add to the value in terms of branding and excellence, teachers must focus on implementing creative ideas in the school and class room situation.
- 4. To improve upon the participation of teachers in this scheme, you are requested to give wide publicity among all the Kendriya Vidyalayas/teachers to take up innovative projects to solve the various problems pertaining to teaching-learning process and other areas in the class room situation. The Principals should also be instructed to identify some innovative action research projects based on recommendations made in the subject committee meetings held in the Kendriya Vidyalayas. The Innovation and experimentation scheme is also to be made one of the integral components in inservice courses organized at cluster and regional level.
- 5. It is reiterated that the desired interest has been found lacking so far as Innovations and experimentations in Kendriya Vidyalayas are concerned.
- 6. It has, therefore, been decided to reinforce innovations in Kendriya Vidyalayas through innovation awards.
- 7. The salient features of the scheme are as under:

- 7.1 All serving teachers of Kendriya Vidyalayas are eligible for participation.
- 7.2 The teachers who are willing to undertake the innovative practices in their Vidyalaya should seek the permission of their respective Principal in advance for implementation.

7.3 Suggested format of the paper

The author is free to evolve his/her own format for the presentation of the innovation or experimentation in the form of paper. However, the following should be suitably incorporated in the paper

Genesis

In this section, the author may briefly describe the background of the project, specially his/her motivation of undertaking the project. How did the idea occur to the author and how did he/she go about to concretize the idea in the form of an implementable project.

Preparatory work

The author may describe the preparatory activities undertaken by him/her for the execution of the project. Obviously, the preparatory work shall include mobilization of required resources human as well as non-human.

Execution of the Project

The author should narrate how the project was implemented describing the activities undertaken during different phases. Limitations and problems or difficulties, may also be brought out.

Results

The author should clearly bring out the results achieved through the execution of the project and highlight if there is enough evidence indicative of improvement in some aspect of teacher's work like teaching, pupil-learning, classroom management, interpersonal relationship, etc.

Conclusion

In this section, the author may summarize the results and bring out implications for systemic improvements, provide guidelines for the replication of the innovation in other similar contexts.

8.Terms and Conditions

- 8.1 A participant should **indicate the level of school e.g.** up to class V, VIII, X or XII at which he/she is working at the time of submission of the paper.
- 8.2 The paper should be based on the **original and independent work** of one person or a team of 2-3 persons. In the case of a team, bio-data of each author should be given separately. The cash prize will be divided equally among team members.
- **8.3** Only one paper can be submitted by an individual or a team in a year for the competition. Paper should be original and prepared on the basis of innovative practices adopted in the class room situation and its visible learning outcome.

- 8.4 The paper should not be based on the participant's dissertation or thesis submitted or MA/M.Ed, M.Phil/Ph.D degree or any other university degree for any other award or joining institutional programme. A copy of the certificate to this effect (Annexure I &OII) duly attested by Principal should be enclosed with the paper.
- 8.5 **The paper may be of 2500 to 3500** words excluding appendices. The references may be given at the end of the paper.
- 8.6 The paper and its summary in about 500 words should be submitted in duplicate.
- 8.7 The paper may be written in either in Hindi or in English. Names and addresses of the participants should not be written on the paper.
- 8.8 Each copy of the paper should have a **cover page giving title of the paper** in Hindi and English.
- 8.9 The project report should be written in a systematic manner. Innovative papers should reflect the following:
 - a) Author's imagination, creative and original thinking in selecting the problem.
 - b) Clearly and specifically state title of the project in Hindi and English.
 - c) Rationale for designing innovative work or practice and its objectives.
 - d) Effective and meaningful presentation and organization of content.
 - e) Results/findings/inferences and conclusions in clear words.
 - f) References/bibliography.
 - g) Any supporting data/documents/tests, etc. used.
 - h) Educational implications of the practice or experiment, especially utility for teachers, teacher-educators, students, student-teachers, parents and society.
 - i) Applicability of results in the field.
 - i) Cost effectiveness in the implementation of the practice.
 - 8.10 The participant should submit a certificate in the prescribed profroma (Annexure III) from the Principal/Head of the Institution.
 - 8.11 A participant receiving the award in a particular year will not be eligible for the cash prize in the next two subsequent years. However, certificate for the paper, if selected, shall be awarded.
 - 8.12 The KVS reserves the right to use the selected papers in any manner it deems fit.
 - 8.13 In all matters pertaining to the competition, the decision of the KVS shall be final and binding on the participants.
 - 8.14 The papers shall not be returned to the authors.
 - 8.15 Its extension in the teaching-learning situation in other Kendriya Vidyalayas should also be kept in mind at the regional level.
 - 8.16 The evaluation scheme would be a two tier scheme, first, at the regional level and second, at the Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (HQ) level involving the experts.
 - 8.17 The composition of committee at the regional level consists of 3 members: Deputy Commissioner of the region as Chairman, an Assistant Commissioner and

an expert from other bodies. Committee will evolve its own criterion for evaluation.

8.18 The selected proposal at Regional Office will be sent to the Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (Hqrs) to be1st scrutinized by a screening committee of 05 members under the Chairmanship of DC (Acad.), KVS (HQ) including other officers of the rank of AEO and above of KVS (HQ) being a subject expert for awarding the points as per following criteria of evaluation. Thereafter finally scrutinized by a team of 5 academicians consisting of Addl. Commissioner (Acad.), Joint experts two Commissioner (Acad), JC (Trg) and NCERT/SCERT/CBSE/reputed colleges etc. The evaluation of the papers will be broadly based on following criteria:

- **9.** The Principal concerned should also write a CITATION about the project as mentioned in Annexure-I
- **10. Specific Information:** It has been observed that most of the proposals forwarded by the Regional Offices have the following shortcomings:-
- 10.1 The project reports submitted by the Regional Offices are based on routine activities and does not appear to be of innovative in nature.
- **10.2** They are too lengthy and subjective without any logical findings, some project reports are suggestive in nature and it seems that actual implementation has not been tried or tested.
- **10.3** The specific target groups (class etc.) has not been recorded (specified) and hence credibility is lost.
- **10.4** Some projects are replicas and more than one teacher has presented similar material on same topic.
- **10.5** In some cases only web-links or down-loaded material from various websites have been incorporated without specifically bringing out any relevance.
- **10.6** The Principal's observation on the implementation and effectiveness of the project is not available which is crucial to assess the merit, hence a preliminary screening at Regional level is required so as to enable this office to arrive at an objective assessment on the quality and genuineness of the projects.
- **10.7** Due screening at Vidyalaya level and RO level should have been done to eliminate substandard project reports.
- **11.** The forwarding/recommendation in respect of ZIETs Gwalior, Mumbai, Mysore, Bhubneswar, Chandigarh and abroad KVs will be done at RO, Bhopal, Mumbai, Bangalore, Bhubneswar, Chandigarh and Delhi respectively.

- 12. It is therefore, requested that the projects may be submitted after proper screening by an expert Committee to be constituted at Regional Level. The Principals' observations regarding efficacy of the project may also be taken into account. If need be, the teacher may be subjected to viva-voce (interview) at Regional Level to assess the credibility and effectiveness.
- 13. The selected papers at the regional level may be sent to KVS (Hqrs) by 30.06.2016. Each Region will send at least two papers one each of Primary teacher and Secondary/Sr. Secondary teacher along with 02 recent passport size coloured photograph with name and post on backside of photograph. Needless to say that paper should be of high standard. The papers already awarded by any other agency viz. NCERT/SCERT/ and other educational body may also be forwarded for special consideration. In case no recommendation is being made a NIL report be sent by the last date.
